

Statement of the Eastern Partnership Civil Society Forum Georgian National Platform on the Results of Negotiations between the Ministry of Energy of Georgia and Russian State-owned Company Gazprom Export

The Ministry of Energy of Georgia completed negotiations on conditions of a new transit agreement to be concluded with Gazprom Export and presented it to the Government of Georgia. According to the agreement, Georgia loses the benefits of receiving in kind gas (10%) and shifts to monetary payment for Russia -Armenia gas transit.

The agreement approved by the Government dramatically worsens the transit benefits for Georgia both in economic and energy security terms. Moreover, Georgia becomes increasingly dependent on Russian political will. Due to this agreement, Georgia loses substantial volume of in-kind gas received for the transit and fully shifts to monetary compensation from 2018 that is be several times less than transit gas value. The new approach also strengthens Russia's position with regards to concluding new agreements on transit.

According to statements made by representatives of the Ministry of Energy of Georgia, the new agreement envisages that Russia will supply natural gas to Georgia for 185 USD per 1000 cubic meters but only for the so-called "social" sector and in case of deficit. It is noteworthy that this relatively favorable price is guaranteed only for two years under the Agreement. In the future Russia will most likely increase the price, considering the fact, that Georgia no longer has any lever to bargain with Russia on it.

The Russian side demanded revision of conditions for the gas transit even last year, although the issue was resolved successfully. It is noteworthy that we have maintained old terms and conditions of the old agreement with the Gazprom Export over years and so far Georgian side was successful in preserving the existing conditions.

Despite the fact that energy security is subject of high public interest, especially when it is related to the Russian Federation, which has occupied part of Georgian territory, the agreement on gas pipeline and gas supply signed between the Government of Georgia and Gazprom Export has been declared to be confidential and commercial secret.

We believe that the new transit agreement signed with Gazprom Export represents not only an energy sector issue but it is a part of national security in broader sense. Therefore, during the process of the agreement preparation broad consultations with international experts and academia should have been conducted. The process must have been implemented in a transparent manner and the government should not have made a decision without taking into account public opinion. Unfortunately, it is an example of irresponsible and unacceptable

approach. We are sure that the use of all current political, social and professional resources during the negotiations could have avoided such an outcome.

Member organizations of the Eastern Partnership Civil Society Forum Georgian National Platform demand the following:

- Remove the confidentiality classification from the agreement concluded between the Government of Georgia and Gazprom Export and publicize the information on negotiations and their results;
- Conduct a parliamentary debate on the aforementioned issue and energy relations with Russia;
- Revise the current sector management practice and develop the country's long-term energy development strategy targeted at reducing dependence on imported energy resources including the ones imported from unfriendly countries;
- Accelerate the energy sector reform process in the European integration and Energy Community format, which will create preconditions for more transparency, professional growth and greater international support;
- Ensure involvement of civil society in the aforementioned processes.
