Second Statement of the Georgian National Platform of the Eastern Partnership Civil Society Forum on the Case of Azerbaijani Journalist, Afgan Mukhtarli

The members of the Eastern Partnership Civil Society Forum Georgian National Platform denounce the alleged kidnapping of Azerbaijani activists and journalist, Afgan Mukhtarli. According to the victim and his lawyer, he was arrested in Tbilisi by Georgian speaking individuals and was moved illegally into the Azerbaijani border. Additionally, he has sustained multiple physical wounds.

Despite numerous calls made by public officials of various countries, international HR organizations, civil society, Georgian National Platform included, to the Georgian authorities to fully, transparently and timely investigate the journalist's case, the investigation has stalled and detailed information is still unavailable to the public. The journalist remains under arrest.

Furthermore, EU Parliament's special resolution on Mukhtarli case stresses the importance that the Georgian Government clarifies every suspicion that its secret services were involved in forced disappearance of the journalist, calls on the authorities to protect human rights undertaken by the European Convention on Human Rights and ensure, that Mukhtarli returns to his family to Georgia safely.

We, the member organizations of the Georgian National Platform believe that the investigation has had enough time to investigate the case in an objective and thorough manner, but that the process is clearly stalled, which in return, damages Georgia's image internationally and renders Georgia's human rights safeguards questionable. This is a substantial challenge faced by Georgia on its way to becoming a developing democratic country that respects rule of law above all else.

Given all of the above mentions, we the signatory organizations demand that public is immediately informed in greater details how the investigation is progressing, that the journalist's case is impartially investigated and that perpetrators are punished adequately. Furthermore, given high public interest in the case, we ask the Parliaments Human Rights Committee to summon leadership of respective agencies and hearing them out at the Committee hearing dedicated to Mukhtarli, while the Georgian Parliament must utilize every

instrument under its disposition, a temporary investigation commission included, so that questions surrounding the case are answered in a timely manner.
