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## The appeal of Civil Society Forum Georgian National Platform member organizations to the Georgian Authorities on the issue of abolishing the status of self-governing for the 7 Georgian self-governing city

Carrying out decentralization strategy and establishment of local self-government that fits European standards was the core aspect of the Association Agreement with the EU and of the local self-government reform. It was the first, important success of the self-government reform that the Self-Government Code was adopted and the first respectable progress was noted, with having 7 new self-governing cities that were in line with the reform strategy.

Self-Government reform was the single most successful reform that was liked and supported not only in Georgia, but among democratic institutions and states in Europe. To support the reform, enhance its abilities and increase the effectiveness of population inclusion, European and American institutions have supported numerous projects and have spend sizeable resources. Consequently, with the support of the Georgian society and Georgia's strategic partners, the process of establishing a new type self-government system that fits with democratic standards had began. Further enhancment of self-government and bringing it closer to the population is only possible by pursuing it, increasing its intensity and depth.

It is alarming, that one of the most successful reforms of recent times and its results face existential threats, at the detriment of the interests of the Georgian population.

The decision of the Georgian Government and the Parliament, to stop or reject the continuation of the commenced reform, reject approximation of the self-government to the people and refusing to engage in dialogue with the population whether to abolish the status of the newly established 7 self-governing cities — cannot be supported and will be assessed as clearly a step backwards and in the process, it will also worsen the quality of democracy in the Country.

Furthermore, the Parliament planned hearing of President's veto, who has rejected the law adopted by the Parliament on abolishing the 7 self-governing cities.

Given the above-mentioned, we call upon Georgian authorities to revise its decision on abolishing the 7 self-governing cities, to continue the reform and to present the public its decentralization and self-government reform strategy.
